#### Center for Advanced Learning (CAL)

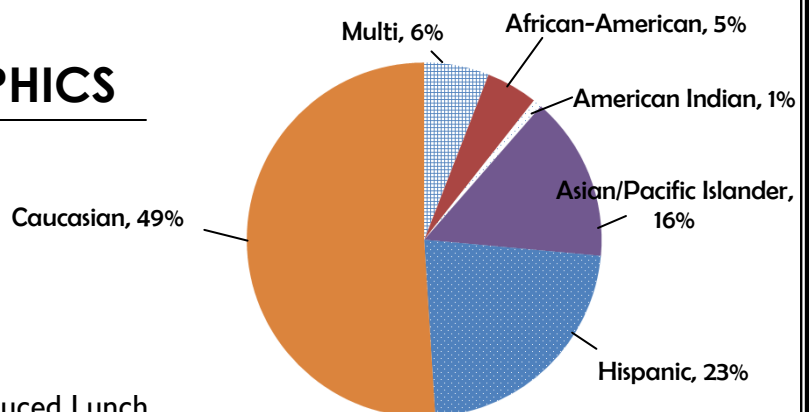

## CLASS OF 2016

## GRADES & RANKING

The GPA calculation is generally unweighted.

A = 4.0 B = 3.0 C = 2.0 D = 1.0 F = 0

Students participating in Advanced Placement (AP) courses will have weighted grades in those courses based on a 5.0 point scale where an 'A' is equal to 5.0 points, a 'B' is worth 4.0 points, a 'C' is 3.0, a 'D' remains 1.0 and an 'F' is worth 0.0.
