

CHS Credit Check

This document was created to be used with your student's transcript to help you understand whether or not your student is on track to graduate with their class.

A transcript shows a lot of information – a student's history of classes taken in high school, the grades earned in each class, and a grade point average (GPA), to name a few. This check sheet is to help you read your transcript and determine whether or not your student is on track to graduate with a strong GPA to prepare them for after high school.

All diploma types require a complete set of credits across important academic disciplines.

WHAT KIND OF STUDENT SHOULD LOOK INTO THE 24-CREDIT DIPLOMA?

Any kind of student! Students who have found it most beneficial are:

- students who don't want to take any second language classes or have tried and not passed second language
- students who have a job and need dismissal periods to get to work
- students who have gotten behind on credits overall and need the chance to take fewer electives

DO COLLEGES CARE WHICH DIPLOMA I EARN?

Colleges won't automatically see a major difference between the Basic Diploma and the standard Centennial Diploma. Colleges and universities will mostly be looking at your grades and the difficulty of the classes that you chose throughout your high school career. Please note that students who pursue the Honors Diploma will be the **most prepared** for the difficulty of college classes and will be the **most eligible** for college admission and scholarships.
